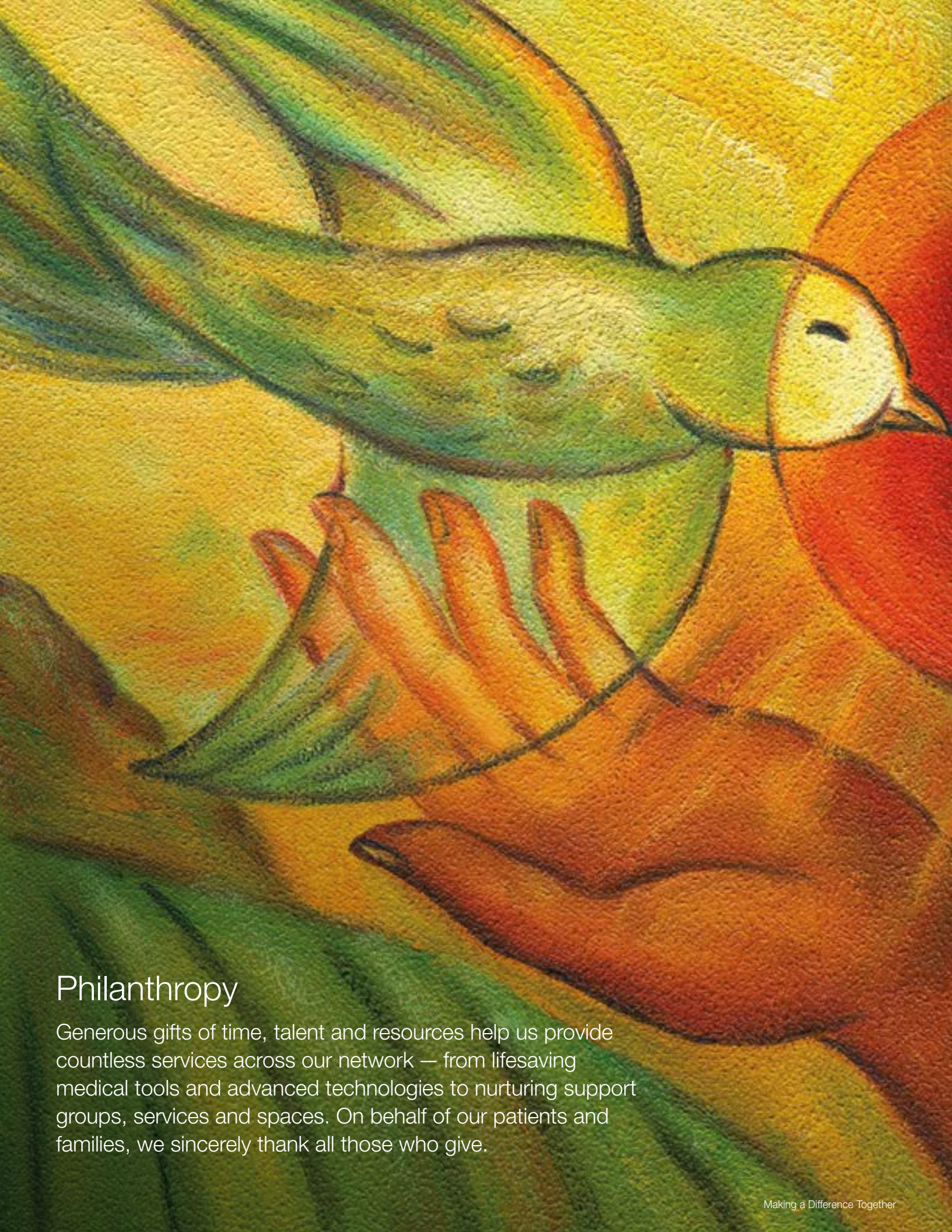


Sutter Health doctors, hospitals and home health agencies routinely rank among top performers nationally and in California for providing high-quality patient care, and our efforts have been recognized:

Hospice

Understanding illness and death of a loved one can be confusing and painful especially for a young person. Bereavement and art therapy services and the Children's Bereavement Art Group help children and teens cope with their grief and heal from the pain of losing a loved one.

Pet Therapy

A welcome visitor to patients, dogs or other animals help diminish pain and the need for pain medication, in addition to providing comfort and reducing loneliness and anxiety.

Therapeutic Music

Music has an extraordinary power to bring comfort and peace. Evidence-based clinical studies with hospital patients show that therapeutic music reduces anxiety, pain and pain perception. It also increases relaxation, and promotes feelings of well-being.

Infusion Center Chairs

As a busy hospital, it is vital to our patients' health and well-being to update or replace standard equipment as necessary. Features of our new infusion center chairs include heated seats and patient control for additional comfort.

Breast Biopsy System

This system allows our clinicians to perform upright stereotactic biopsies using 3D imaging. An upright unit ensures it can be used for all patients including those with mobility restrictions and offers maximum comfort when a biopsy is performed.

Staff Education and Training

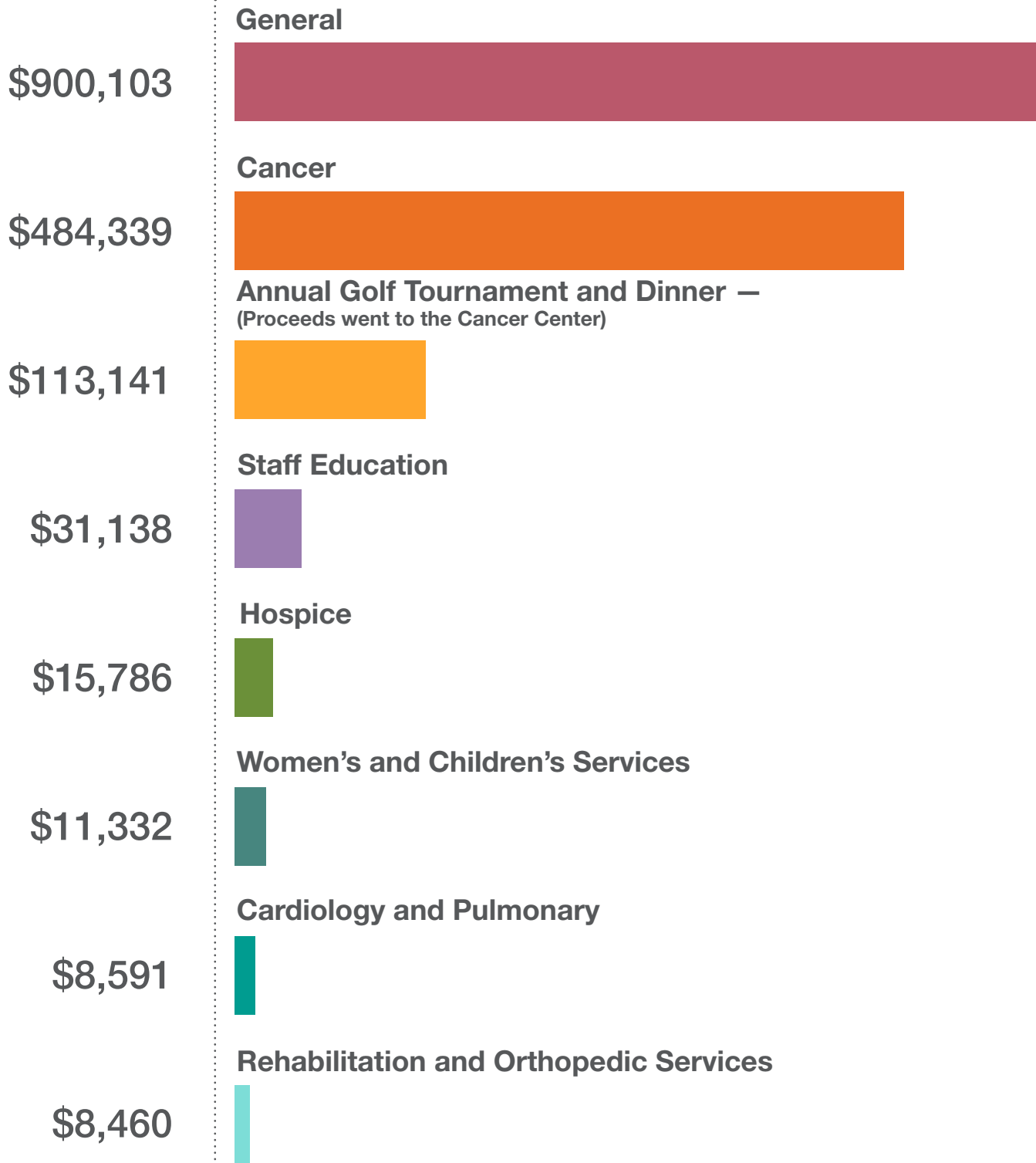

Rosella and Kevin Kelly

“Cancer hits too close to home for everyone,” said Rosella Kelly, explaining that her sister Nora passed away in 2012, after a nine year battle with breast cancer.

Recently, Rosella and her husband Kevin helped Sutter Medical Foundation in Roseville purchase tomosynthesis, powerful 3D imaging technology which allows radiologists to spot suspicious masses that might otherwise be obscured by thick or dense tissue.

“After learning about this awesome technology, and what happened to my sister, I immediately thought, ‘how can I help?’ I have to help. Cancer is real and it rips families apart. I have experienced that. After we learned about tomosynthesis, we wanted it in our community so we could benefit from the advanced technology along with our family members and friends.”

When doctors caught Nora’s cancer the first time, it was in stage 4. Rosella said, “My sister was very diligent about getting her mammograms, so ignoring signs or procrastination was not the cause. We feel that 3D tomosynthesis would have helped find it sooner if it was available to her. Maybe she would still be with us today. Detecting it sooner than later, in our opinion, is the key to



survival and why we are passionate about supporting the 3D tomosynthesis project at Sutter Health. Being that it could potentially be genetic, that scares us. I want to be around for my kids and grandkids. My husband wants me around too!”

Rosella grew up in Sacramento as the youngest of 12 children. Today, she and her husband Kevin live in Granite Bay with their three sons, Adam (11 yrs), Logan (9 yrs) and Jake (1 yr) — who were all born at Sutter Roseville Medical Center.

Sutter Roseville Medical Center Funding Priorities

Cancer Center: Opening this year, the Sutter Roseville Cancer Center is one of the most urgent health care projects in our region's history, offering many philanthropic partnership opportunities and the promise of improving people's lives. The hospital plans to consolidate certain cancer services into one location, bringing oncologists and other physicians side-by-side and adjacent to important programs such as the infusion center, genetic testing, social services, pet therapy, music therapy, clinical research and the cancer registry.

Surgical Services: Investing in advanced surgical equipment improves quality and clinical outcomes and ensures patients have access to the very best care locally.

Breast Health: 3D mammography is a powerful new tool in the early detection of breast cancer, enabling radiologists to determine the size, shape and location of potential tumors with a single scan. With 3D mammography, tumors cannot hide. The greater accuracy of 3D mammography means fewer "false positive" results; upwards of 40 percent fewer women will need to come in for further testing. We have less than \$95,000 to raise before we can purchase a second 3D mammography machine in Roseville.

Therapeutic Music: Music has an extraordinary power to bring comfort and peace. Evidence-based clinical studies with hospital patients show that therapeutic music reduces anxiety, pain and pain perception. It also increases relaxation, and promotes feelings of well-being.

Pet Therapy: Studies have shown that pets can lower stress and anxiety. The hospital seeks support for its pet therapy program, which connects trained therapy dogs with patients and families to lift spirits and provide comfort.

Sutter Health Funding Priorities

Medical Research: The Sutter Institute for Medical Research (SIMR) combines world-class research efforts with community-based medical care. Through SIMR, physicians take part in hundreds of research studies, advancing our understanding of disease prevention, diagnosis and treatment. In addition, Sutter Health is raising funds to support a Biobank that will link blood sample data and electronic health record information from consenting patients in more than 100 Northern California communities. These studies will help researchers better understand how people develop disease over time, leading to more personalized treatment and improved care.

Child Abuse Response Program (BEAR.): The Bridging Evidence & Resources (BEAR) Center is a joint program between Sutter Medical Foundation and Sutter Children's Center, Sacramento that provides care to infants, children and teens who have been seriously neglected or physically or sexually abused. Donor support allows the BEAR Center to provide vital 24-hour child abuse assessment and community resources throughout the region.

Telehealth: Telehealth technology allows Sutter Health to serve patients at the right place, at the right time with the right provider. Through live interactive video capability and image capture, we can enhance and improve patient access to primary care and specialist providers. Gifts towards telehealth technology will provide solutions to health access problems such as geographic access to health care consultations, limited after-hours care, in-home management of chronic diseases, and patient monitoring to avoid expensive hospital readmissions.
